

# REPORT FOR CHRISTIAN WITNESS TO ISRAEL

## LONDON

I was with CWI during their London outreach this summer from July 27<sup>th</sup>. - August 10<sup>th</sup>. This was a new experience for me as I had not done anything with CWI in the past. Having met up with the rest of the team on Saturday 27<sup>th</sup>. July I was made very welcome by everyone and quickly got to know some of them very well.

It was a pleasure to be in the company of so many Christians from different denominations and backgrounds all serving the same Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Monday 29<sup>th</sup>. July was my first day doing outreach at Trafalgar Square and Leicester Square. The team was led by Asaf and we interacted with various people including Jewish people. On the whole the people we spoke to were polite and friendly and took the tracts.

During the training we were told to begin by asking what they thought would bring peace to the world and what would bring peace to their own lives. I also asked if they had faith in God as I thought this was a good way of beginning conversation with them. As the days went by I became more confident and wanted to speak to as many people as possible about the Lord Jesus Christ as the Saviour of sinners.

We visited Stamford hill on two separate days which is predominately Jewish ultra-orthodox and this was a bit more challenging because they felt threatened by the claims of Jesus and the Gospel being brought into the community. This is an area that feel needs to be evangelised frequently as I noticed there are a lot of young families needing Christ.

I particularly enjoyed talking to the people at Hamstead Heath Park and at the tube station there.

During the outreach I made good friendships with Bruce and Sohana MacKenzie and two Malaysian ladies and the people from Hong Kong.

I thoroughly enjoyed the outreach over the two weeks and felt the time passed really quickly, however, I missed having the Lords Day for resting and personal devotion.
